Section 1: Ordinance Number 54 of the City of El Paso de Robles passed and adopted on the 8th day of June, 1896, and all amendments thereto, are hereby repealed.
Section 2: It shall be unlawful for any person in an intoxicated condition to appear or be in or upon any public place in the City.
Section 3: It shall be unlawful for any person to intrude upon or be in or remain in the premises or property of another, without the consent of the person lawfully in the possession of such premises and premises or property of the City, without first procuring a written permit to do so from the Chief of Police.
Section 4: It shall be unlawful for any person or persons within the limits of this City to fire or discharge any firearm of any nature whatsoever within the limits of the City, without first procuring a written permit to do so from the Chief of Police.
Section 5: It shall be unlawful for any person or persons within the limits of this City to fire or discharge any firearm of any nature whatsoever within the limits of the City, without first procuring a written permit to do so from the Chief of Police.
Section 6: No person shall sell, offer for sale, exhibit, circulate or cause to be circulated or distributed, in any way furnish or attempt to furnish to any person any slug, metal, bullet, rock, or other substance, or person shall sell, offer for sale, exhibit, circulate or cause to be circulated or distributed, in any way furnish or attempt to furnish to any person any paper which, read as a whole, is of an obscene, vulgar, or indecent nature.

AN ORDINANCE TO MAINTAIN THE PEACE AND GOOD ORDER OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES, TEXAS, BY REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES PASSED AND ADOPTED ON THE EIGHTH DAY OF JUNE, A.D. 1896, AND ALL AMENDMENTS THERETO, AND BY ENACTING THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS:

Section 1: Ordinance Number 54 of the City of El Paso de Robles passed and adopted on the 8th day of June, 1896, and all amendments thereto, are hereby repealed.

Section 8: It shall be unlawful for any person within the city limits of the City to throw or discard any bottles, glass, garbage, waste materials, or trash, on any street, alley, or public property or upon any private property located within said City.

Section 9: It shall be unlawful for any person to cut down, mutilate, or injure any tree or shrubbery in any street, parkway, or on public premises within the limits of this City, except upon order of the City Council or proper City Official.

Section 10: It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to disturb the peace and quiet of any person, any neighborhood, family, public meeting, or assembly of people, by loud or unusual noises, offensive conduct, by threatening, by quarreling, or by using obscene language or gesture.

Section 11: No person shall directly or indirectly deposit, pass, throw, scatter, cast, or post any hand bill in or upon any public property or public utility pole within the City; this section shall not prohibit handing of any hand bill to any person willing to accept same.

Section 12: No person shall directly or indirectly distribute, deposit, place, throw, scatter, cast or post any hand bill in or upon any private yard, grounds, walk, porch, house or other private property.

Section 13: No person within the limits of this City shall urinate in any public place or place open to public view.

Section 14: No person shall within the limits of this City operate a sound truck or other vehicle equipped with loud speakers without securing a license to operate such vehicle.

Section 15: Every person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall

be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or shall be punished by imprisonment in the County Jail for not exceeding Ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.


