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
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### Paso Robles Public Artwork Interactive Map

# Short-Term Rental Task Force

The City Council has requested the creation of a task force to examine issues and opportunities related to short-term rentals, in order to develop recommendations for the Council's consideration. Short-term rentals are homes and second units that are rented out for fewer than 30 days at a time. It is estimated that there are more than 300 now in operation in the City, many without having received the necessary license. Short-term rentals can offer an attractive option for people wishing to visit our community but, if not managed properly, can negatively impact our neighborhoods.



The City is seeking a mix of perspectives to participate in the task force, in order to develop recommendations that are best overall for our community. ## *City to Evaluate the Economic Impacts of the Paso Robles Airport*

At the March 15 meeting, Paso Robles City Council adopted a resolution that authorized an agreement with the Minnesota Department of Transportation for use of the MnDOT Web Based Economic Impact Calculator for General Aviation Airports. This software is free for the City to use, with the purpose of identifying the economic impacts, to the Paso Robles communities and businesses, of having the Paso Robles Airport.

For example, when the Airport hosts a "fly-in" event, several airplanes with pilots and families come to Paso Robles. They stay in hotels, eat in restaurants, visit wineries, and purchase goods and services. Depending on the size of the event, the impact can be tens of thousands or hundreds of thousands of dollars.

In addition, there are a number of businesses located at the Paso Robles Airport that contribute to the local economy with jobs, taxes, and significant local economic activity.



The City adopted an Airport Business Improvement Plan three years ago that was jointly developed by the Paso Robles Airport Association (PRAA) and City staff. The Business Improvement Plan includes a number of actions to improve the Airport, and most specifically to improve the Airport for businesses, leasing, and related economic activity. The Economic Impact analysis is included in the adopted list of recommended actions. The City's Airport Advisory Committee has been instrumental in working with staff to implement the Business Improvement Plan, and recently endorsed moving forward with the Economic Impact Analysis.

While the software use is free, the City expects to spend about \$800 to purchase local economic data (from the IMPLAN process) for San Luis Obispo County. Staff will then work with local people to enter the Paso Robles Airport specific data. The local data will include information about the number and type of aircraft housed at the Airport, the number and type of businesses and services housed at the Airport, local event information, and much more.

Once local and regional data has been input, the software will generate a tally of the value to the Paso Robles economy of having the Airport, and perhaps more importantly, will be able to evaluate the local value under different circumstances through scenario modeling. Residents can expect more information in the future as the economic impact calculator project moves forward over the next few months.

# **Landscape and Lighting Maintenance District Re-balloting**

The City of Paso Robles Landscape & Lighting Maintenance District will be re-balloting a small number of District Zones and Sub Areas to give residents the opportunity to vote on their neighborhood’s assessment rate. Re-balloting decisions were triggered when current assessments are not meeting current costs for street lighting and landscape services.

## **Residents being re-balloted have already been notified by mail.**

The re-balloting Information Sessions will take place on Tuesday, March 29 and Wednesday, March 30 from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. in City Council Chambers at City Hall. The sessions will answer all questions regarding the process and allow impacted residents to learn the outcomes of a “yes” or “no” vote.

## *Hazardous Materials Training*

Members of the Emergency Services Department and other Fire and Safety agencies participated in a Hazardous Materials training exercise hosted by Lubrizol Corporation, located near the airport. The training was based on a simulated leak of an industrial chemical from one of the facilities 5,000 gallon tanks. The plant conducted an evacuation and initiated the 911 call for outside assistance. The regional Hazmat team responded, with members from all FD agencies in the county and environmental health, to develop an action plan and mitigate the leak. The team had the leak repaired within 90 minutes from the initial call and had the plant back up and running shortly thereafter. It was a successful training day for all parties involved.



### *Amtrak Train Class*

Members of the Emergency Services Department, Cal Fire and San Luis Obispo City Fire recently attended an Amtrak train emergency response course. The course covered how to safely respond to both passenger and freight train emergencies.

Crews practiced how to stabilize the Amtrak passenger car and safely remove patients from available doors and windows.

Reminder to all City Staff and community members - it is once again time to check and change your smoke detector batteries. A 2011 study by the National Fire Protection Association noted that 38 percent of deaths involving fires occurred in a dwelling without a working smoke detector due to a dead battery. ## City Receives CAFR Award for Excellence in Financial Reporting


For the 16th year in a row, the City received the California Society of Municipal Finance Officers Award for **Outstanding Financial Reporting** for their Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for fiscal year 2015.

This award was earned due to the long, hard work of the Administrative Services Department staff. It is important to recognize the many long hours that Finance Manager Deanne Purcell, and Administrative Assistant II Catherine Piatti put into this project. Besides the hard work to create the report, Deanne spent many additional hours updating the layout, format, and reporting structures to give the CAFR a modern and more readable appearance.

The CAFR is a set of U.S. governmental financial statements comprising the annual financial report for the City that complies with the accounting requirements set-forth by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB).

This year, the CAFR required a new addition known as GASB 68 (financial reporting of pension liabilities). This one statement alone added 21 additional pages to the CAFR and took considerable time and effort to calculate and implement into the report.

The Administrative Services staff will next begin a complete overhaul of the budget book. It will be a ground-up design, such that the reader will be able to understand the purpose of each department and the roles played to help keep the City prosperous.


Wyatt reported to the Centennial Park office on Monday, March 21 after taking his oath as our newest employee in front of City Manager Tom Frutchey.
