The Activity Guide, published three times a year, features all of the new and returning recreation classes




Robles City Library's summer reading program for years, and this is the first time he'll be offering a camp.



About CVPP: *CVPP members function as the “eyes and ears” of the Paso Robles Police Department. Members patrol the city with CVPP’s own marked, radio equipped patrol cars looking for anything which may need police attention. CVPP members conduct traffic and crowd control at special events such as parades, the California Mid-State Fair and downtown events. Other duties include vacation house watch checks, crime scene protection and traffic control at accident sites. Members may also be called upon for Search and Rescue work.*

SLO County Wildland Urban Interface Drill




The Paso Robles Department of Emergency Services participated in the annual county-wide mutual aid wildland drill in Cambria last week. Mutual aid is for large scale incidents that overwhelm local agency capabilities. SLO County enjoys a strong pre-planned mutual aid deployment system that Paso Robles participates in.

Fire personnel participated in a simulated large scale wildfire in the community of Cambria. Crews received a briefing of a fire burning scenario into the drought stricken Monterey Forest area. Pre-attack fire maps of the community were utilized as crews rotated to three training sites. The evolutions included engine companies deployed to provide structure protection, extending hose to attack a simulated fire front and lastly fire crews performed line construction work in which crews cut back vegetation in an effort to create a fuel break.



The overall drill had 150 fire personnel attend, 30 fire engines from both San Luis and Santa Barbara Counties and allowed for the Cambria Pre-Attack plan to be exercised in advance of a real emergency to the community of Cambria.







The workshop provided participants with an overview of workers' compensation laws and benefits, the responsibilities of employees and employers, the various benefits available to injured employees, how to identify the root cause of the injury, and Cal/OSHA reporting of workers' compensation claims. The information received in the Work Comp 101 workshop will aid supervisors and managers in providing the necessary information to injured employees and in facilitating the employee's safe return to work.
