

Cava Robles RV Resort to Begin Construction

Sun Communities is close to breaking ground on a 327 space, upscale recreation vehicle resort located at the north end of Golden Hill Road along Huer Huero Creek. The project was originally approved in 2004, was amended in 2012, and has been refined to enhance the architecture, on-site amenities and reduce conflicts with residential neighborhood. Oak tree protection is an important part of the project. City staff and the project arborist toured the site this week to review oak tree maintenance trimming and protection fencing requirements prior to construction. A&T Arborist will begin maintenance trimming operation and tree protection fencing next week. Construction and site grading are expected to start in July once the tree protection and biologic surveys are completed. When completed in 2017, the project will be the premier RV facility in San Luis Obispo County and will generate significant transient occupancy tax revenues for the City.

Creston Road Corridor - Caltrans Planning Grant

Caltrans recently notified the City that they are being awarded a Planning Grant to assist the City in developing a community vision for the Creston Road Corridor from South River Road to Niblick Road.

The grant, in the amount of \$185,000 will be used to fund a comprehensive and robust neighborhood and community outreach to solicit input and ideas for improvements.

Administered by Caltrans, the grant program was created to “...provide a safe, sustainable, integrated and efficient transportation system to enhance economy and livability.” Design features that could be included are: safe routes to school, bike access and pedestrian access that meet the American Disability Act (ADA), and re-surfacing of the road will also be part of the improvements implemented.


In the next few months, City Staff will be scheduling neighborhood workshops and meetings to solicit input on what citizens envision Creston Road should look like. Once the City Council adopts a Master Plan, then the City can then apply for another grant for up to \$5-8 million to aid in construction costs.





Centennial Pool Re-Opens This Week for the First Time in 5 Years

Facility to Offer Full Summer Aquatics Schedule and Pool Parties This Summer

Centennial Pool officially re-opened for the first time in five years at 12:30 p.m. on Monday, June 13 during a ribbon-cutting celebration. City staff, architects, designers and contractors who worked on the project, and members of the Paso Robles REC Foundation and the community were on-hand to witness the momentous day. Director of Library and Recreation Services, Julie Dahlen presided over the event while Mayor Steve Martin addressed the crowd and did the honors at the ribbon-cutting.



Dahlen remarked that the re-opening of Centennial Pool was symbolic of the community and its resilience as a city. “Thank you to all those who worked on the project,” she said. “We greatly appreciate the support of elected officials and the community.”



Paso Robles Mayor Steve Martin spoke to the assembled crowd, calling the day a “truly an amazing occasion. Paso Robles is a can do community,” said Martin. “Our citizens decided the pool was important to our kids and all of our community. I want to thank everyone involved. This pool re-opening is an incredible show of team work.”

Martin and Paso Robles City Councilman Steve Gregory led the charge in support for the Centennial Pool reopening by raising \$75,000 at the *Everyone in the Pool* fundraiser held Saturday, April 30 at Centennial Park.

The pool gates were opened to swimmers at 1 p.m. Eight-year-old Oletha Hagen was the first one to take the plunge.

The Centennial Pool has undergone construction over the last several months with necessary upgrades, deferred maintenance and accessibility standards addressed.

Centennial Pool will have a full aquatics schedule this summer including swimming lessons, community swim times and pool parties. Swim lesson sessions will be held between June 20 through August 12.

Pool parties are available at Centennial and Municipal Pools on Saturdays from June 18 to August 13. The parties include a reserved VIP party area, ice cream cups and party favors for each guest, exclusive access to the pool during swim breaks, and lifeguard-conducted fun and games during breaks. Both Centennial Pool, (600 Nickerson Drive,) and Municipal Pool, (534 28th Street,) will be open Monday through Saturday from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. June 13 through Aug. 20. The daily swim rate is \$5 with a 10 punch pass available for \$45.

Read for the Win!! *Summer Reading Challenge for Children and Teens*

Read for the Win! This year's theme for the ever-popular Paso Robles City Library's Summer Reading Program is off to a winning start! One hundred twenty-one children and 31 teens registered to participate in the annual reading incentive program the very first day. As of Thursday evening, the number had grown to 320 total, with more registrations to come over the next few weeks. (Typically, over 1325 children and teens register for the Library's summer reading incentive program in the first month.)

It has been well documented that the amount of learning lost over the summer months is significant and that much of the fall quarter is spent catching up. According to the California Library Association, summer reading loss is cumulative. By the end of 6th grade, for example, children who consistently lose reading skills over the summers will be two years behind their classmates. Adds City Librarian Angelica Fortin, "exercising their minds during the summer months helps children and teens maintain their school-year momentum, improve their reading skills, and return to school in the fall ready to learn and succeed."

Self-selection, access to books, and sharing books are essential factors in reading motivation and are key elements of summer reading programs. In addition to reading, this year's participants will enjoy a variety of Olympic-themed educational and entertaining events—arts and crafts, storytelling, music, movies, magic, and more. And the fun has already begun! Wednesday's Zumba® for Kids, in the Library Conference Room, was a huge success!

All Summer Reading Programs are free of charge and open to all children and teens! The Summer Reading Program is June 13-August 13. Check the Summer Activity Guide for more information about when and where the programs will be offered.

The Paso Robles Police Department Police Activities League (PAL) hosted ‘opening day’ for this year’s Junior Giants season on Monday, June 13, at Barney Schwartz Park. League Commissioner Officer Tony Ruiz and Chief of Police Burton welcomed the players, parents, and coaches and kicked off the season with Chief Burton throwing out the ceremonial first pitch.

Junior Giants is a free, noncompetitive, coed baseball program for under-served youth ages 5-18. Working together with local agencies, families and volunteers, Junior Giants reaches out to the community and offers youth a chance to learn the basics of baseball during the summer while also discovering the importance of self-esteem and respect.

Entering its 21st season, as a member of the Junior Giants Community Program, Paso Robles Police Activities League annually serves approximately 200 participants. Junior Giants is more than just a noncompetitive baseball program. Junior Giants players learn the Junior Giants ‘Four Bases of Character Development’: Confidence, Integrity, Leadership and Teamwork, as well as the importance of Education, Health and Bullying Prevention.

Parents are needed to volunteer as either a coach, assistant coach or team parent. All volunteers are required to register for a background check prior to being on the field.

Fireworks Prohibited in Paso Robles

The Paso Robles Department of Emergency Services is urging Paso Robles residents to observe a safe, legal and fire free holiday. Due to drought conditions, high temperatures, predicted low humidity and the threat of fire, we must all do our part to be fire safe. Residents are advised that Fireworks are illegal in the City of Paso Robles. Officials warn that individuals caught lighting or possessing even “safe and sane” fireworks in the City are subject to citation and fines. Misdemeanor violations are punishable by a fine. In addition, anyone found responsible for setting a fire using any type of fireworks will be responsible to pay for property damage, suppression costs and may be charged with a felony. This liability also applies to parents of juveniles found responsible for causing a fire. Statistics show that of reported injuries, the most common were from “safe and sane” fireworks including sparklers, which can cause 3rd degree burns. However, in fires related to fireworks, illegal fireworks accounted for the greater percentage of property loss.

The opportunity to observe firework displays in a safe manner will be available at some of the surrounding communities. Please check with them for times.

The Paso Robles Department of Emergency Services wishes the community a memorable 4th of July and requests a common sense, safe celebration. We further encourage anyone possessing fireworks to turn them in to their local fire department, without fear of penalty or prosecution, so that they may be safely disposed of.

2016 Summer Aquatics Team




The City will also be welcoming back 7 water safety instructors from the previous summer, as well as 2 assistant pool managers.






