2. Supplemental Sales Tax Oversight Committee

The Supplemental Sales Tax Committee provides a forum for citizens to review and report to both the City Council and the community as a whole on matters relating to Supplemental Sales Tax revenues and expenditures resulting from both Measure E-12, approved by the voters in 2012, and Measure J-20, approved by the voters in 2020. The Committee provides oversight of the expenditures of the supplemental sales tax revenues to ensure that they are being spent on community priorities established by the City Council, based on information gained from business and resident surveys and other means. The Committee shall determine if the funds were spent appropriately, and report that to the Council and public. The Committee may also provide advice to staff and the Council. Council has previously held three interview sessions for both At-Large Committee members and Community Organization Committee members and has appointed seven At-Large committee members and three Community Organization committee members, leaving one position vacant on the committee. Since the last round of interviews, SSTOC has received one more application to fill the final vacancy. Applicants are listed below:
